




INTRODUCTION





1. ORIENTATION PROGRAMME ON SURVIVAL AND DEVELOPMENT OF GIRL CHILD

Date 11-May To 15-May New Delhi 2015 **Objective** - The Constitution of India offers all citizens, including children, certain basic fundamental rights like the right to life and liberty, right to equality, right to freedom of speech and expression, right against exploitation etc. however, the situation of children, particularly girls in India is unsatisfactory. In the Census 2011, it was observed that child population declined by 2.4 percentage points in rural areas and 1.6 percentage points in urban areas. There has also been a considerable fall in the Child Sex Ration from 927 in the year 2001 to 919 in the year 2011. The Sex Ration being 943 females per 1000 males in the 2011 Census.

Vision & Mission – The Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD), being the nodal agency for women and children works in a holistic manner to protect their rights and addresses the challenges faced by them through multifaceted schemes and programmes. The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme has been in operation since 1975 and addresses the health, nutrition and development needs of young children, pregnant and nursing mothers.

Contents – The programme contents would broadly cover; status of children in India with special emphasis on girl child; causes and consequences of gender discrimination at early childhood and remedial measures; prevention of sex determination; child marriage; prevention measures on violence/abuse of girl child; child trafficking; life skills for adolescent girls; communication strategy for survival and development; child rights; legislations; policies/ programmes for girls child etc.





Many of the Funding Partners or Facilitating Agencies are asking for the Knowledge Documents development by the NGOs for the enlightenment of their internal functionaries as well as for their Community Based Partners. In such knowledge documents, you have to cover one or more issues that are relevant to your area of functioning. In other words the Knowledge documents should have relevance with the roles and responsibilities of the functionaries of your organisation.

The term INSTITUTIONAL TRANSPARENCY is becoming very popular now days. It is desired by your funding partners and assignment providers that you organization should maintain Institutional Transparency. To be precise every functionary of your organisation should be well aware regarding the process flow that is adopted while implementing each and every significant task of your organization.

External Evaluation Report (EER) has emerged as the most important document in the development sector. For getting any significant project, prestigious assignment or getting empanelled under any reputed body of high stature; you need to submit an External Evaluation Report of your organization.



In the present scenario it is desirable for an organization to attach a report on IMPCT ANALYSIS, while submitting a proposal, EOI or application to a Funding Partners, Assignment Provider or Facilitating Agency.


While writing the impact of the interventions of your project, never highlight the developmental progression of the direct beneficiaries of your project. Rather try to portray the development incurred by the people of the community who were not your direct beneficiaries. Try to establish the chain reaction by which the development of your direct beneficiaries has in turn facilitated the development of the human resource of the community and the natural resource of the community.

- ➤ To encourage continuing educational programmes on accurate information on diagnosis and treatment of diseases.





Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP) has been announced on 15th August, 2008 and launched in place of REGP Scheme. PMEGP is a credit-linked subsidy programme launched by Ministry of MSME in 2008-09 for creation of employment in both rural and urban area of the country.


7. Objectives of the Survey




The Board




